Please prepare approximately 16-32 (1:15-1:30 max in length) bars of music in the style of the show. An accompanist will be provided as well as the equipment needed to audition with a track. Please bring your clearly labeled sheet music in a book or a binder and be ready to communicate any cuts or tempo changes to the accompanist. Please be sure to slate before your audition. This production is rated 'PG'

After you sing: Kindly retrieve your binder from the accompanist. The production team may ask that you stay for a few moments if they need to hear or see something else from you, however, assume you're finished unless asked otherwise.

<u>CDC Guidelines:</u> There is no current mask mandate, but you are welcome to be masked for your own safety. Masks may be enforced throughout the rehearsal process. *Guidelines subject to change.*

<u>Video Auditions:</u> If you are unable to make the general auditions (we strongly recommend an in person audition), a video recorded song that should not exceed 2 minutes may be submitted

before April 18, 2023 to selmaartscenter@gmail.com. Please send via unlisted YouTube link. However, you MUST attend the mandatory callback (should you be called back) on April 20, 2023 in order to be considered for a role. If this is not possible, please email selmaartscenter@gmail.com with any questions or concerns. NOTE: Please be sure to submit an audition form when you submit your audition video.

Self Tape Instructions:

- Use/find a neutral backdrop.
- Your space should be well lit. We need to see you.
- Start with a slate. It doesn't have to be full body.
- Your self tape should be filmed horizontally
- We should be able to hear you. Avoid using a room with lots of echoes...
- Create a focal point. Look either to the left or right of the camera and keep it subtle

<u>Callbacks:</u> You will be taught a short dance combo, so please come dressed to dance and move. After movement we will proceed into music and scenes. Some auditioners may be released early, however this does not impact your chances of being cast.

PRODUCTION INFORMATION

- Audition Form, Audition Packet and tentative schedule are available online and will be available at the audition.
- Due to the tight rehearsal schedule, all conflicts must be presented during your auditions. Conflicts presented after the first rehearsal will not be honored. Please note that excessive conflicts will affect casting decisions.
- PERFORMANCE CONFLICTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED
- Casting notification will occur no later than April 24.
- Rehearsals for this production will be held Monday through Thursday from 6:30pm-10:00 pm. Some Friday and Saturday may apply with notice

There will be a cast and company meeting/orientation on **May 1** at 6:30pm.

- Communication will be done through phone, email and Discord- please list a valid email address on the audition form.
- Performances: June 16–July 1 for a total of 13 evening performances (3 weekends)

Synopsis:

This is what you're meant to do. You just don't know it yet. Before she captivated the world as Grammy Award-winning Latin pop icon Gloria Estefan, she was Glorita. Coming of age in 1970s Miami, young Gloria breaks from family expectations and embarks on a musical journey with her bandmate Emilio. On Your Feet! The Story of Emilio and Gloria Estefan tells the story of this power couple's rise from humble beginnings to international stardom. Roles:

GLORIA Female-identifying. 20s-30s. Cuban. Starts off shy, but slowly opens up as the show progresses. Becomes an icon. Sharp sense of humor. Strong Actress with star quality. Fluency in Spanish is preferred. Must sing pop, and move well. Mezzo-Soprano.

EMILIO Male-identifying. 30-40s. Cuban. Confident, Handsome, Loyal, Leading tenor with character. Sometimes stumbles over his English as well as his emotions. Fluency in Spanish is preferred. Vocal role. Baritone.

GLORIA FAJARDO Female-identifying. 50s-60s. Cuban. Gloria's brassy, strong-willed mother. Latin matriarch. Biting humor. Fluency in Spanish is preferred. Vocal role. Mezzo-Soprano.

CONSUELO Female-identifying. 60s-70s. Cuban. Gloria' Grandmother, who comes off as a Cuban stage mother. Wise, loving, and warm. Always pushing Gloria to achieve her dreams. Fluency in Spanish is preferred. Some vocals.

YOUNG EMILIO/NAYIB Boy age 8-12. Doubles as Emilio Estefan as a boy, as well as Gloria Estefan's son. Must be a strong dancer. Fluency in Spanish is preferred, though not required. Not a singing role.

LITTLE GLORIA Girl age 10-12. Cuban. Innocent, smart, and self-reliant. A little sad, but always hopeful. Fluency in Spanish is preferred, though not required. Vocal role. Mezzo-Soprano.

ENSEMBLE A diverse group of strong dancers and pop singers that will play multiple parts – all gender-identities and ages. Some understudy principal parts.

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
